Archery is a great activity that takes time, patience, and focus, which is something all children need to experience.



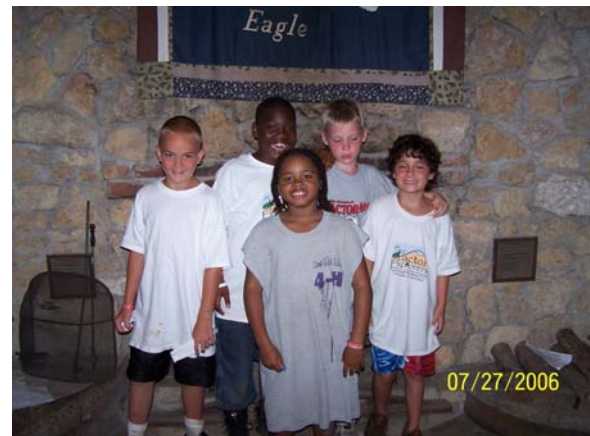
### **The Medical Staff.**
